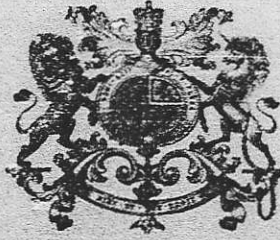

CORONER'S PRECEPT.

To the Constable of *Her*  
*Westminster*

By virtue of my office, these are, in Her Majesty's name, to require and command you immediately upon sight hereof, to summon and warn ~~one~~ *one* good and lawful men of *Her Westminster* to be and appear before me, *George* *Pellew*, one of the Coroners of *the County* at *Her Westminster*, in the said *County* on the *fourteen* day of *January*, at *eight* of the clock in the *fore* noon, then and there to enquire of, do, and execute all such things as on Her Majesty's behalf shall be lawfully given them in charge, touching the death of *one* *Samuel an Indian*. AND be you then and there to certify what you shall have done in the premises: and further to do and execute what in behalf of our said Lady the Queen shall be then and there enjoined you.

GIVEN under my hand and seal, the *fifteen* day of *January*, A.D. 18*91*.

Information of witnesses

Information of  
witnesses generally

to wit: I being on behalf  
of our Sovereign Lady The  
Queen, touching the death of  
Sumah an Indian at the Pas-  
sage Gate in New Westmin-  
ster in the County of Westminis-  
ter on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of January  
in the year of our Lord one  
thousand eight hundred and  
ninety one before me, George  
Pittendrigh Esquire, one of  
Her Majesty's barons for the  
said County, on an inquisition  
then and there taken on the  
view of the body of the  
said Sumah an Indian  
then and there lying dead,  
as follows, to wit:

That W. J. Armstrong of New West-  
minster in the said County  
of Westminister, Sheriff, upon  
oath said produced the Calendar  
of the High Court New Westminister  
18<sup>th</sup> November 1890 - Sentencing  
the said Indian Sumah to be  
hanged by the neck until dead  
on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of January 1891.

William Moses by Governor of  
the Provincial Jail at New  
Westminster, County of Westminster  
being sworn saith that the  
body which the jury has seen  
buried by the death was that  
of one Juanah an Indian who  
was executed by hanging, by  
the neck until dead in accor-  
-dance with the sentence of  
the Assize Court 18<sup>th</sup> November 1890  
by the Justice Deakin, and  
was executed this day 16<sup>th</sup> January  
1891.
